

News from the Parish Council and Recreation Field Trust



Misterton Parish Council hope this finds you all well as we start 2021. We would like to take this time to remind everyone that the Covid support network remains in place and anyone isolating or needing support can get in touch with the team of volunteers or the parish council (contact details at end of article). We would also like to thank Jackie Hewitt for her efforts over many years with the Misterton Emergency Response Team, and hope she enjoys a well-earned rest now she has stepped down. Volunteers are always welcome to join the team – just get in touch.

The weight restrictions at the bridge next to the Globe Inn continue. The weight restriction and diversion order are in place for 18 months; however, we have received an updated indication from the Bridges Team at County Hall that they are hoping for some remedial works to begin in February. We will keep you posted with developments as this may change as the situation progresses. There is also some pavement surfacing scheduled in January, but we have asked to see if the two projects can liaise over road closures and timings to reduce disruption.

Still on the subject of bridges, the Mill Lane bridge was taken out before Christmas by the County Council. They hope that a replacement bridge will be in place in the spring but need the ground to dry out first.



Gardening notes



The existing boundary is a dozen or so homes past the Old Stagecoach Inn and one house has its kitchen in Misterton and its lounge in Crewkerne parish.

Tony Dalton

Tony Dalton has been a film buff since he was six years old. One might even say that he is movie-obsessive, having worked in the film and television industries since 1969.

He was born in Redhill, Surrey in 1947 and spent all his childhood in Caterham, going to infant, junior and senior schools there. His mother, who lived to be ninety-nine, was one of sixteen children. As a result, Tony, his brother, and sister had fifteen pairs of uncles and aunts. They also had about a hundred cousins. His father came to England from Waterford in Eire as a sixteen-year-old. He served in the Irish Guards during the Second World War and became a caretaker after demobilisation.

Tony became an apprentice electrician, working mainly in Croydon. He hated the job, but his parents wanted him to have a 'good' trade. They must have been surprised when he gave it up to take his first job in showbiz as an assistant booking manager in the film library at the British Film Institute. He moved on from that to be the film programmer for the BFI Regional Film Theatres, responsible for selecting film seasons. He also interviewed many celebrities, among them Peter Cushing, Charlton Heston, Harold Lloyd and the noted pioneer of film animation, Ray Harryhausen.

After seven years, he left the BFI to be publicity consultant for such 1970s films as *Star Wars, Close Encounters of The Third Kind* and *Sinbad and the Eye of the Tiger.* He reviewed films for popular magazines, industry publications and wrote several storylines for the *Eagle* comic's strip, *Dan Dare, Pilot of the Future*.

In 1977 he joined the Everyman Cinema in Hampstead, London as programme planner, responsible again for compiling film seasons in addition to writing brochures and organising publicity. On the strength of Tony's work in Hampstead, Leslie Halliwell, the writer of *Film Guide* and *Filmgoers' Companion*, invited him to join Granada Television as the network publicity officer. He went on to carry out film research for literally hundreds of programmes during a period of some twelve years. These included *Brideshead Revisited*, *Jewel in the Crown*, *The Hound of the Baskervilles*, *World in Action*, and film biographies of James Mason, Laurel and Hardy, David Niven, and Ingrid Bergman.

It was when he moved to Birmingham to work for ATV that he met his husband-to-be, Tim. As Tony says, 'and we've never looked back.' Tim is principally an art historian but has had many jobs in his time. He has been a window-dresser at Liberty's shop in London and has worked for Paramount Pictures. Now, like Tony, he is a film historian. They have been together for forty-three years.

In 1992 Tony became a freelance film researcher and consultant. He worked on the BBC Discovery series, *The Promised Land*, travelling widely in the USA searching for footage and stills. Since then, he worked on a wide variety of programmes for the BBC, Channel 4, and Sky among others. For his work on *Edward VIII*, *The Traitor King* he won the 1996 Indie Archive Award.

He is hard to pin down about his favourite film of all time. 'I love them all,' he says, 'from the late 19th century right up to the present day.' But at the top of his list is James Mason's film



from 1954, 20,000 Leagues Under the Sea, which Tony saw for the first time when he was seven. Others are Trip to the Moon (1902), Napoleon (1927), Casablanca, Citizen Kane, The Third Man and Dunkirk (the 2017 version).

Since 1985 he has lectured on film history at The Museum of London, BAFTA, and many universities. His subjects have included The History of Animation, History as told by the Movies, Special Effects, and the Hammer films. He has published five books about Ray Harryhausen and coproduced a film about him. He has also coauthored a biography of Freddie Francis

who was famous for his work on Hammer's horror films. Tony is still writing, and at the moment is proof-reading his new book about the director of Hammer Films – *Terence Fisher, Master of Gothic Cinema*. It is due to be published next year.

He moved with Tim from the Isle of Wight in 2019 to their 17th century Grade II listed house – once the New Inn pub – in Silver Street. From there he walks Queenie, his cocker spaniel bitch, around the village. She is nearly twelve now and has a bad back, so has to be carried upstairs. Tony likes to read novels, 'but not the sort that win the Booker Prize,' and, of course, biographies of film actors. At present he is re-reading that of Jack Hawkins.

His musical tastes are wide; they range from Gershwin through Beethoven and Sibelius to the Beatles and the Beach Boys. His most-admired Beach Boys' record is *Good Vibrations*. It is an excellent choice.

He used to like travelling when younger but is now content to take holidays in Britain. His most enjoyable foreign holidays were in Egypt, which he visited three times, even cycling with Tim in the Valley of The Kings. He admits to being passionate about ancient civilisations and their archaeology. Other holidays have been spent in Crete, Greece, and Iceland.

Tony has had a stellar career, being a successful author and mingling with stars of what used to be called the Silver Screen. And he is still working. We wish him all the best for the future.

The Annual Show

The end of an era – or not?? Or is it a case of 'all good things must come to an end!'

Having trawled through the WI minutes, it appears that the annual show was started by the WI after they acquired their hall in the late 1960s. From that day to this they have organised this popular show year in and year out on behalf of the village and I believe it has been a popular event inclusive of all the village and beyond. As you will be aware, I have actively been seeking help to carry on running this show and was fortunate enough last year to be offered the services of Alison Lennox (who lives across the road from me in Silver Street). Alison offered to take over the computerised system from start to finish and be involved in the general running of the show, along with her daughter assisting – the W.I. would continue to play their part with booking judges, etc. and organising on the day.

I personally have decided I can't commit to it this year (in fact, I am hanging up my hat permanently but will be happy to oversee any handover should anybody be interested). Sadly, there are no members able to take on the organisation of the show; however, they are willing to help on the day and Alison is also happy to help; bearing in mind our age range from 70 up to 92 (the majority 80+) this should not come as a surprise! However, I think we can hold our heads high and bow out without further ado. All the cups/trophies and past records are in safe storage at the WI hall.

On behalf of the WI I want to thank all the villagers for the part they have played in making the annual show the success that it has been – be it as a helper, judge, competitor, winner, loser!! Apparently, the show used to be held in the WI hall until it got too big when it transferred to the village hall, to whom we extend special thanks for free use of the hall over the years.

Slow Cooked Lamb with Lemon and Oregano

Some think January food should be all about healthy eating, but at times when it's cold and wet outside, what you really crave is a hearty warming casserole. The secret to this slow cooked lamb is a heavy, deep pan with a good, tight fitting lid.

Serves 4-6

2tbsp olive oil

900g Charlotte potatoes, washed and thickly sliced

8 medium sized shallots, peeled

1 garlic clove, cut in half across the middle

4 good sprigs of oregano

3 bay leaves

2 tsp sea salt

Good grinding black pepper

Approx. 1.64kg shoulder lamb, boned, skinned, and trimmed of a little fat

2 small un-waxed lemons, cut in half

200ml vegetable stock

- 1. Pre-heat the oven to 180°C, 160°C fan, gas 4.
- 2. Pour the oil into a large ovenproof casserole pan. Add the sliced potatoes, shallots, garlic, oregano, bay, salt and pepper.
- 3. Trim the lamb and cut into 8-10 large chunks. Place in a bowl, squeeze over the lemon juice and season well.
- 4. Arrange the lamb, all juices and squeezed lemon halves on top of the vegetables. Pour over the stock. Cover with a tight fitting lid and cook in the oven for 3-3 ½ hours until tender. Baste the lamb with the juices occasionally.
- 5. To serve, spoon the lamb, vegetables, garlic and herbs onto a warm serving dish and spoon over the juices.
- Serve with olive bread and a simple, dressed watercress salad.

Misterton's mystery musician

They mystery of the unknown Last Post player has been solved! The Friends of Misterton Cemetery Chapel hired them to play on Remembrance Sunday outside the chapel. Clearly a worthwhile venture given that the music could be heard and appreciated at the other end of the village.

Avian influenza: Latest situation

The government introduced new measures from 14 December 2020 onwards to help protect poultry and captive birds from this highly infectious disease. Poultry and captive bird keepers are legally required to keep their birds indoors, or take appropriate steps to keep them separate from wild birds. Bird keepers are advised to be vigilant for any signs of disease in their birds and any wild birds, and seek prompt advice from their vet if they have any concerns. They can help prevent avian flu by maintaining good biosecurity on their premises.

All keepers are encouraged to register their birds with Defra so they can be contact quickly if there is a disease outbreak in their area and they need to take action. If they have more than 50 birds, they are legally required to register their flock within one month of their arrival at their premises. If they have less than 50 birds, including pet birds, they are still strongly encouraged to register.

Poultry and captive bird keepers and members of the public should report dead wild birds to the Defra helpline on 03459 33 55 77 (option 7), and keepers should report suspicion of disease to APHA on 03000 200 301. Keepers should familiarise themselves with Defra's avian flu advice.

Public Health England advise the risk to public health from the H5N8 and H5N2 strains of bird flu is very low. The Food Standards Agency has said that on the basis of the current scientific evidence, avian influenza poses a very low food safety risk for UK consumers. Properly cooked poultry and poultry products, including eggs, are safe to eat.
