Misterton Emergency and Resilience Team update

As the rain falls and a stream runs down the lane outside, this month's submission seems particularly apt as the weather reminds us that one of Misterton's perennial problems is with us again. Recently the Misterton Emergency and Resilience Team (MERT) has been working on our flood plan and despite April being a really dry month May seems to be making up for it.

We are working with Somerset County Council, in particular the rivers and highways departments, to try to keep water flowing where it should and not flooding down roads or into properties. To bolster our position we are collecting data so we have proof of the challenges Misterton faces, which we can use to inform the council and raise with our MP if necessary.

To make a strong case we need as much evidence as we can collect, so we are asking the village to contribute by providing any records available with respect to flooding and any actions taken to tackle it. Photographs and notes would help the case, together with the dates when the incidents occurred, so we can produce a timeline of the problems. If you can contribute please do so by emailing information to us, and we will gather the evidence together for future reference when needed.

Misterton Bridge repair – update

Many villagers were astonished to learn from last month's magazine that the bridge over our village stream (actually named the Paddockslake) dates from the 17th Century.

These two photos reveal what it was like when it was built, and it is amazing to think that the bridge has stood the test of time so well for over the last 300 years. One of the photos also shows the secondary tunnel containing the overflow channel. And the pipework (ugh!) which was put down more recently by Vodaphone to carry its broadband service.

Just imagine the masonry skills of our village forebears and their use with the local hamstone. Without, of course, of any of the machinery and other resources we have today.

Our thanks as a village should go to the firm named Walters carrying the reconstruction project. Their foreman Shaun Simons was most interested in the job and said, 'they don't build things like this any more'. All his team were very understanding and approachable. And thanks must also go to the residents on either side who have had to put up with a long detour to get to Crewkerne or Bridport. There's another side to this, however: lack of traffic through Middle Street. As Rayph Bradshaw said to me 'it's like Misterton was when I was a young boy'.



I am glad I have you guys on my side 🥫



From Misterton to the Arctic Circle in a white van

Hello! We are Verity and Michael, both originally from London and temporarily living in Misterton. Last summer, despite a global pandemic we set off in our self-built campervan on an 11,000 mile trip around Europe. Luckily, we had built the perfect place to self isolate.

Our campervan has everything we need to be self sufficient and wild camp in remote places. We have a convertible bench sofa that doubles as a super king sized bed, a hot shower, a composting toilet, a fridge and two ring gas hob. We completed the conversion ourselves on the street outside our rented London flat, including installing our diesel heater, water and gas systems, and solar power.

We set off in July 2020, after travel restrictions were lifted, with the



intention of spending a couple of months in France. At the time, the borders of some countries had not reopened, so our original plan of heading to Norway was not possible. After spending a night on the coastal road in Dover we got up early and boarded an eerily quiet ferry to Dunkerque. On the ferry we discovered that Norway had just announced that they were opening their borders in a few days' time. With that in mind our original plan was back on.

We opted for a ferry from Hirtshals in the north of Denmark to Kristiansand in Norway instead of via the bridge to Sweden. At this time, Sweden was a red zone, so we avoided travelling through.

Denmark was operating a transit only policy to foreign visitors at this time; we learnt this after being turned around at the border by some friendly Danish soldiers. We had to wait until the day of our ferry and drive across the country without stopping. This was a reminder to us that we had to keep up to date with restrictions put in place as the situation was constantly changing.

We were travelling after the first wave of Covid and things appeared to be getting back to normal. Despite this, we never intended to spend much of our time in urban areas or cinemas, bars and cafes as these would most likely still be closed. Also, our budget did not cover many visits to restaurants, especially in Norway!

Once we arrived in Norway we headed up the west coast, passing several fjords on our way to Bergen. We then headed further inland, navigating our way through the mountain passes and various ferry routes. There were some epic drives across the Atlantic Road and down the famous Trollstigen pass. Over the next six weeks we made our way further north, reaching for our thermals whilst the rest of Europe appeared to be having a heatwave! We crossed the Arctic Circle at 66° north and visited the beautifully wild Lofoten Islands before a final

visit to Tromso.

After leaving Tromso we headed towards Finland. At this point we were missing the sunshine and warm weather and so we made some long drives south, avoiding reindeer on the road, visiting a husky reserve, and making a stop in Lapland along the way. We visited Turku and Oulu and finally Helsinki where we took the ferry across to Estonia, which featured live music, dancing and cocktails during the 9am crossing...

We did not know what to expect from Estonia, Latvia and Lithuania, but were pleasantly surprised by both the scenery and the cities. In our haste to get to warmer climates we left the Baltic states too soon and will definitely go back.

After Lithuania we crossed into Poland, another country that we loved - we tried traditional pierogi and wild boar stew. We visited part of the vast Masurian Lake District before spending time in the vibrant cities of Warsaw and Krakow and then travelling south to the



Tatra mountains for a few days hiking on both the Polish and Slovakian sides. It was September by now, and here the world almost felt back to normal. Shops were open and restaurants were buzzing - we were able to enjoy pit stops for cheap beers as we passed mountain huts. We enjoyed the freedom of eating out, not knowing that the pandemic was about to get worse again.

We had caught the last warm days in Slovakia, but snowstorms were expected imminently. We crossed the country to Bratislava - a trip down memory lane for Verity, who had studied as an Erasmus student there in 2013, and a chance to meet up with some fellow British van

dwellers that we had met through Instagram! After ten weeks of only each other for company, we were thrilled to spend an evening sharing stories of our travels with some new people.

We then parted ways and crossed into Austria where we spent the next couple of nights parked by vineyards before heading into northern Italy and a quick visit to Lake Garda before making our way towards the west coast.

On the day we arrived in Italy, it was made compulsory to wear masks both indoors and outdoors. After spending the last few months in the relaxed Nordic countries, it felt like reality had hit again. Covid-19 cases were starting to rise once more across Europe, and Italy introduced orange and red zones where travel was not allowed.

The weather was still beautiful, and we enjoyed some coastal spots all to ourselves, which were available to park at for free as the official Italian summer season had ended.

Our travel options became more restricted by November. The UK had gone back into lockdown, and there were only a few regions of Italy that remained open for free movement. We had made it as far south as Bari, before having to turn around.

We headed back to a region further north and met up with our friends again, who we spent the next month driving in convoy around the Lazio region with. When restrictions were relaxed slightly,



we managed to book a fourteen hour ferry to Sicily together to spend our final part of the trip.

We spent time in lockdown making some upgrades and repairs to the van. A tour of the UK is on the cards and once restrictions ease again we will be back to Europe and beyond.

Following on from February's article about the Crewkerne train disaster, there was another local train accident, the previous year on 25th Oct 1952, that you may not be aware of.

A train with eleven coaches was travelling from Crewkerne towards Sutton Bingham at 75mph when the tender's brake hanger detached and dropped onto the track causing a eleven foot long three hundredweight 'check rail' to be torn out of position. This big rail travelled through the battery box and the floor of the leading coach. It passed through three passenger compartments and emerged through the roof of the fourth!! One child was seriously injured, and seven other passengers received slight injuries.

The train stopped at Sutton Bingham station where a doctor and ambulance attended. After thirty minutes of temporary repairs the train left Sutton Bingham for Yeovil.

Bit of a shock for the occupants!!


Nonetheless by June you should have planted most things, perhaps progressively throughout the month. Lettuce, beans, radishes and beetroot benefit by successive plantings and will extend the season for you. Keep your greenhouse well ventilated and if you have tomatoes pick out side shoots regularly.

In the flower garden, do look after the plants you have set out earlier. Give everything a feed of liquid fertiliser (I use Tomorite for most things) and, in periods of hot weather, water

plants in the late evening or early morning. The same goes for hanging baskets of course. You will be well rewarded for the care you give all your flowers and vegetables.

Of course, June is the month when roses are at their best. We have a fair number of them. My favourite? This varies but in June Gertrude Jekyll takes some beating. It is colourful and has a wonderful scent.
