News from the Parish Council and Recreation Field Trust



April's parish council meeting was cancelled in line with guidance for local councils in a period of national mourning so there is no news to report this month. However, the Bridge Team at Somerset County Council has been kind enough to put together an account of the repairs to Misterton Bridge together with a brief history which they hope readers will find of interest.

Misterton Bridge repair - April/May 2021

Misterton Bridge is in the middle of Misterton, just outside The Globe Inn, and carries the A356 (Middle Street) over a small unnamed stream. The bridge is in the form of a circular arch with a span of 2.1m and a rise from the stream bed to the soffit (underside) of the arch of 675mm. The depth of fill over the top of the arch is just 145mm, which is taken up by the road surfacing.

The bridge was reportedly constructed in the 17th century, meaning the bridge is now well over 300 years old. It became part of the 18th century turnpike road, Seavington St Michael to Maiden Newton. The bridge was constructed of ashlar blocks of Hamstone from a local quarry. It was originally built to a length of about 5.5m, probably wide enough to take horse drawn wagons and carts. Later extensions were added at each end in a similar construction method to the original structure. The downstream (northern) end was extended by approximately 1m. The upstream (southern) end was extended by about 1.8m and kinked at 25° to the centre line of the rest of the bridge. The total bridge length is now 8.29m. In 1933 a 100mm thick concrete invert (on the stream bed) was constructed. The structure was given a Grade II listed status in 1987.

A bridge inspection in 1994 advised there were structural inadequacies, and these were attended to in 2002. A system called Archtec was inserted into the masonry arch barrel, comprising stainless steel rods grouted into accurately drilled holes from the road surface. These helped to strengthen the masonry arch. Unfortunately, in the three years from 2005, there were three traffic accidents which impacted on the western end of the upstream parapet wall. The third accident seriously damaged the parapet, and this had the effect of

opening up a significant crack at the downstream end of the arch barrel. Since then, regular inspections have shown that several of the masonry stones forming the arch have slipped down, and in some cases have fallen out of the arch altogether.

The remedy for this state of the bridge was first to apply a temporary 18t weight limit over the bridge. Now construction work is underway to re-grout the masonry arch and provide strengthening of the bridge. This work will entail removing the road surface and fill material down to the top of the masonry arch. A lime-based grout will then be poured by gravity into the gaps between the stones forming the arch. The strengthening work needs the whole width of the highway and consequently a complete road closure has been necessary for the duration of the works. This is estimated at eight weeks.

This strengthening work method required the agreement of the Environment Agency, the Somerset Lead Local Flood Authority and South Somerset District Council (for listed building consent). An ecology survey was also carried out. Further to this an archaeologist has been contracted to inspect the fill removed from the arch, as it is suspected this may be the first substantial uncovering of the structure since the extensions were added.

Specialist advice was sought about a suitable lime grout for this repair work. Usually lime mortar and grout require a very long time to cure; in this instance our suppliers have developed a pre-bagged mix utilising additives that allow the initial cure time to be hours, rather than days, while maintaining the essential qualities of lime mortar - flexibility, strength and malleability.

Once the repair works are complete the bridge will be able to carry all normal highway traffic loads up to 44 tonnes.

Irish Bridge - Newbery Lane

This bridge consists of three concrete pipes running beneath the road. It is a pinch point for the stream where blockages occur regularly after heavy rainfall. The water rises quickly and can eventually flood the road, sometimes making it impossible to pass across. (Height of flood water above road 6th February 2016 was 4 feet/1.22 metres.)

To help prevent large stones and gravel entering the pipes the Misterton Emergency and Resilience Team (MERT) constructed a trial barrier of large stones approximately 15 feet/4.5 metres upstream from the pipes.

Sometime on Saturday 27th March someone dismantled the barrier and created a path of stepping stones to the pipes, then pushed sizeable stones into all three pipes.

We do not believe it was a malicious act, but it was very irresponsible. We know that most youngsters are fascinated by moving water and have the urge to get into it to play. Most of us will have done so.

Would any parents who know or suspect that that their children do play in this area, please ask them not to move any stone structures in the stream, or push stones inside the pipe-

work. Many thanks.










Misterton Church of England First School

We continue to thank everybody who is raising awareness of our school's plight. We are especially grateful to Taylor Larcombe and the group of parents who have worked together to facilitate this legal challenge.

We can now share that we have had confirmation that should the legal challenge be unsuccessful, the staffing framework that is in place at Misterton will remain unchanged for its final year. Any reductions in the numbers



of children attending Misterton caused by children moving to new schools before the end of the year will not affect this important decision. Misterton will continue to serve its community with excellent education for as long as we remain open.

Letter from the Vicar

I do not know about anybody else, but I found this last lockdown much harder than the previous ones; maybe it was the dark days of winter that seemed to compound the isolation and teenagers trapped at home without any obvious means of escape! Trying to make sense of home schooling with dodgy Wi-Fi did not really help either. This time coming out of lockdown does feel more promising though and I do not think it is just the weather, although that helps. The vaccination programme means that many of those who are especially vulnerable to the coronavirus will now have received their injection(s); the NHS is not under the same strain — at least in terms of caring for those affected by the virus and schools are in a better position to maintain continuity with children and young people. Families and friends can begin to meet up and mix again. Organisations, including the Church, have started to open; sport and other recreation activities can begin to happen again. Let us hope that this progress will continue and that together we will be able to avoid yet another national lockdown.

However, Misterton faces some real challenges over the months ahead; under the proposed reorganisation of education in the Crewkerne and Ilminster area, the village school has been earmarked for closure. This would be a huge blow for the village as the school is so much part of the history of this village, but the reality is there may just not be enough children to keep so many schools going. St Leonard's Church too faces a difficult future — we do not have sufficient people to take on the necessary tasks to keep a Parish Church functioning and with less and less people coming to Church on anything like a regular basis, then there are fewer people to call on. There may be a huge range of reasons for this, but there do not seem to be many obvious solutions! Any ideas will be always welcome!

Misterton telephone box becomes a community space

Whilst on one of our many family walks in lockdown, I had a look at the old telephone box. I know the plan is to put in a defibrillator but currently the money is being raised. On closer inspection it got me thinking. I have seen the telephone boxes used for all sorts and wondered if it could be a venue used as a temporary art gallery and a community space.

So, I wrote to the Parish council and they agreed to pay for the materials to smarten up the telephone box. It had already been painted but needed the window panels replacing and a good clean and tidy. I decided to add in a "grass" floor and I designed and printed vinyl lettering stickers made for signage (cheaper and flexible solution).

As a community engagement artist, producer, and creative tutor I had been working on digital art challenges with the community all the way through the lockdowns. I knew I could print out the work I had been sent and display in the "gallery". Much of the work produced was made by children in Misterton who attend my Creation Generation art club in Crewkerne. Maiden Beech and other local schools had been involved and some care home residents from intergeneration projects.

I left plain postcards and paper, and hand sanitizer, in there for people to use and then asked for their work to be returned to me via the cardboard post box. I then decided a book swap* would also work well, for those times the space was not being used as a gallery. Recently some shelves (thank you to Allan Newton) have been added and we are pleased to see people using the space. We have even manged to fix in the defib! Triple use. A real bonus!

I am now working on a new audio and visual art project that will tell the stories of residents of Misterton. I have just completed a successful intergenerational podcasting project available on yeovilartspace.uk/together and I am going to adapt this work for the Misterton Telephone Gallery. The Creation Generation kids are helping, and I am currently approaching long standing residents of Misterton to interview via Zoom. So, keep an eye on the telephone box on your way by in the summer months.

As for the future of the space, I am hoping other local artists in the village may like to exhibit. Please do get in touch if you would like to be involved.

Gardening notes


May is the month to get cracking in the garden. For the most part Misterton soils will have warmed up - so now is the time to start getting things in. In the vegetable garden a sowing of most seeds can be made. Beetroot, lettuce, beans and carrots come to mind. And if you have brought on courgettes, these can be planted out. Of course, there is always the danger of May frosts particularly at the beginning of the month — so do take care. Fleece is useful even if there is just a hint of frost. If you have grown tomatoes from seed, do prick them out and put them in the greenhouse — or outside later in the month.

In the flower garden it is time to get going also. Plant out your hanging baskets using good quality compost, slow-release fertiliser and water retaining crystals. Keep them frost-free until later in the month – the same goes for dahlias and half-hardy plants. If you have a greenhouse, do remember to open doors and vents on warm days - and dampen everything down if there is really hot weather to increase humidity.

Some of you will have seen our wonderful magnolia (pictured below) in Unity Lane before it was hit by a severe frost in early April. I think it is 100 years old this year. When I was young it was in Teddy Harwick's garden — which was then part of Providence Cottage. Whilst I was in my teens Teddy told me that his mother had planted it 'after the war'. I had always assumed that he meant World War Two. But last year I saw a photograph of an identical magnolia in Kew Gardens. This was planted after the First World War.

So working things back I believe it was highly likely that Teddy's expression 'after the war' meant the First World War. And probably it was planted in memory of the many Misterton soldiers who died in that war.
