#### **Misterton Emergency and Resilience Team update**

Now we are into the new year, we are getting back into the swing of routine support activities. I will start with the positives; firstly the Omicron variant seems to be under control, which is good news. As part of a Covid support group I attend regular meetings and get the latest advice from Spark Somerset. I would like to share their information but at present advice and guidance are changing so quickly it will probably be out of date by the time it gets to you. The message that is consistent, from all the experts, is the importance of vaccinations so this is the message MERT support and would like to add if you need any help or information, please let us know.

The next piece of good news is that we ran an Automated External Defibrillator (AED) course at the beginning of January, which was attended by twenty members of the village. The aim of the course is to give those who attend a better understanding and more confidence to use a defibrillator, should the need arise, and thereby assist someone who has had a cardiac arrest. We will organise more courses if there is demand, so please let us know.

Where we have most challenges, in these winter months, is with flooding and drainage. We work with the Parish Council, the District Council and Somerset Highway Services to try to keep excess water under control. As you will appreciate, they are limited by budgets and so all we report cannot be addressed straight away. We will keep following up options to reduce the flooding issues and advise as we progress.

Here's hoping 2022 will be a better year for us all.

The ceremony saw your Chairman, together with the Crewkerne Town Mayor, present a map of the area.

The meeting heard from Tony Foot about problems he was having with access to a field owned by the Owsely Trust a charity that gives support to the less fortunate living in the village. It was agreed to let him seek legal advice on behalf of the Parish council.

There were no planning applications. The council are looking at the purchase of a Speed Indicator Device in an attempt to remind drivers of their speeds

#### Letter from the Vicar

Keeping the Rumour of God alive

One of the images I have found helpful in my Christian life, which actually came from my very wise father, is that of a train journey. God is on the train, and as we travel through life, sometimes we are there with him. Sometimes we are stood on the platform hesitating whether to climb aboard, and sometimes we are miles away wandering over the hills in the opposite direction.

As it is sometimes said – when God seems far away, who moved?

1 John 4:16 God is love, and those who abide in love abide in God, and God abides in them

God is with us always, but whether we sense his presence seems to determine how much we want to be on that train. At times of crises, many of us come sprinting over those hills and leap aboard. When all is going well in life, we may well be wandering in the meadows without a thought of faith or God, but still admiring his wonderful creation.

Thinking on this led me to reflect on our village churches and their future. And I suppose the big question that must be faced is would you miss your church if it was no longer there? It is becoming increasingly difficult to find officers to take on roles such as treasurer and church wardens. At a (Covid aware, lateral flow tested) party over Christmas far away from here I was talking to a couple who were baptised and married in a local village church, and like many people they thought that the government looked after the upkeep. The thought that it might close horrified them, and their immediate response was what could they do to keep it open?


Do we need a train or a church building to see God? Of course not, but to me to lose that centre of love, that centre of pastoral care in our villages, which is happening all over the UK is a source of great sadness, and one that we should be actively fighting, otherwise apathy will win.

God *is* love *is* community – from Isaiah 40 'those who hope in the Lord will renew their strength. They will soar on wings like eagles; they will run and not grow weary, they will walk and not be faint.'

I long to see a new energy in our churches, churches that work for the good of the community that they are there to serve... or perhaps I just need to get back on that train and let God handle things.



#### The Village Hall

1975 was an important year for Britain. Margaret Thatcher paved the way to her premiership by defeating Edward Heath in the Conservative Party's leadership election. The year was marked by inflation reaching 24.2%, so it was no surprise that the National Union of Mineworkers cheerfully accepted a 35% pay rise.

Of more local importance was the building of Misterton's village hall. It remains one of the biggest in the area, high enough internally to accommodate the playing of badminton. But after some 20 years, the building needed updating during the 1990s. For instance, the heating proved inadequate for such a large space and the kitchen needed improvement. Apart from the kitchen and the main hall, there was only one other room, which was used to house tables and chairs. The roof, windows and doors were giving trouble and there was no provision for lavatory facilities for the disabled as was required by law.

The original flooring was parquet, perhaps more suitable for a gracious drawing-room in, say, Knightsbridge, than in rural Somerset. But parquet blocks have a tiresome habit of becoming irregular under pressure. The resultant rickety floor surface was inappropriate for the players of short-mat bowls and interfered with the subtle trajectory of the woods. It also presented a trip 'n' fall hazard for badminton players, not all of whom were young enough to be considered sprightly and capable of surviving injuries.

Accordingly, and after much discussion, some members of the Bowls Club generously took on the task of striking a deal with the National Lottery for a hefty contribution to the refurbishment costs. My chief confidante claims that a certain amount of chicanery was used by them to persuade the Lottery to stump up money. Eventually, though, the deal was done. The Lottery's contribution would be limited to matching the amount raised locally.

There then followed a frenzy of activity to raise the village's share of the money needed for improvements, which now included an extension to provide an extra room suitable for meetings and as a changing room for entertainers. The fund-raising proved very successful, reaching many thousands of pounds to be matched pound by pound by the Lottery. Money was saved by courtesy of the Bowls Club, whose members took on the internal decorating in return for a fish and chips lunch and a handsome cake.

At various times six cabaret concerts were held, three in the village hall and three in the WI's. The emphasis was on fun and frolic for the audiences. And so it proved. The grand finale of one concert was rather risqué. It involved a youngish woman being strapped to a large wheel; her diaphanous clothing augmented by balloons tethered to it in strategic places. Graham White, who made all the props for the concerts, made a sort of blunderbuss. John Gregory, a well-respected dentist, was tasked to fire it as the wheel revolved. However, the first and very loud bang filled the WI hall with smoke and singed off all the hairs on Steve Lyus's arm. The front row of the audience was supposed to be reserved for children, but one elderly lady decided she would have a better view if she joined them there. She did so while ignoring their muttered protests. Much to their amusement, her false teeth flew out at the explosion.

On another cabaret evening, Jeff and Anne White performed their special version of Billie Jo Spear's *Blanket on the Ground* with Anne in an all-enveloping nightdress, and Jeff in his underwear combinations. And Ray and Margaret Darch won first prize in a fancy-dress competition.

At a different concert, Trevor Lowe and Derek Wood together with two ladies danced (choreography by Trevor) to the pop group Bucks Fizz song *Making your Mind Up*. And, yes, as in the Bucks Fizz video, the ladies' skirts were ripped off by the two gentlemen to coarse roars of approval from male members of the audience, heedless of their wives' disapproval. A further sketch featured Carol Walker as Andy Pandy, Diana Dyke as Looby-Loo, and Sue Coquet as Teddy. Another sketch had a troupe of local ladies dancing to *And all that Jazz* from the musical *Cabaret*. They wore bowler hats and black fishnet tights. Again, the performance evoked cries of tasteless appreciation from the men in the audience.

Gordon Glazier was tireless, even driving twice to the Cotswolds where he had heard that some garden centres were closing down. He was able to snap up plants at keen prices. Later, the plants were sold in Misterton – the profits going to the restoration fund. He also spent two full days clearing the village stream for a race involving 100 plastic ducks. Maureen Albert's father travelled down from Edinburgh to organize the betting. The event proved so popular that it was repeated. Stormin' Norman, as Maureen's father had become known, was presented with a certificate of thanks and was granted the Freedom of Misterton.

Another evening provided a band — what did they call themselves? — no one seems to remember. Dr Mark Field was noteworthy for playing a double bass fashioned from a broom handle and a tea chest — skiffle style. At a further concert, three local men performed (in drag) *Three Little Maids from School* from the Gilbert and Sullivan operetta *The Mikado*. Their pockets were full of sweets, which they threw into the audience for children to catch.

#### The Village Hall continued

One sweet hit an old lady in the eye. A successful fashion show was also organised with volunteer models strutting their stuff on a purpose-built catwalk. Maxine Field was one of the models. Clothes were on sale at the back of the hall, and someone wandered into the changing room, took a liking to Maxine's own top and bought it. A certain amount of detective work was need for its retrieval.

The village hall hosted craft shows that offered knitting, jewellery, and woodwork to buyers. Fund-raising bingo sessions were well attended. So much so, that groups of players would arrive by coaches from Crewkerne and local villages. They were encouraged to buy teas, coffees, cakes and to invest in raffle tickets. Every penny was important. Betty Symes found a coin in the road and handed it in to boost the fund.

Yet more enterprise was shown when two Misterton ladies toured the village, offering to clean cars inside and out for a nominal £3 a time. One of these ladies had a garden stall. Its proceeds paid for the stone steps that lead down to the recreation ground from outside the village hall.

Paddy Ashdown, the constituency Liberal Democrats MP, accompanied by his successor, David Laws, opened the refurbished hall in the millennium year.

The foyer has a white, brick wall on the left-hand side. Individual bricks bear the names of people who contributed at least £5 to the restoration fund. Of course, many villagers donated much more than that. You know who you are.

Needless to say, with the inexorable passing of the years, many of the fund-raisers are no longer with us. Nevertheless, the results of their labour and financial contributions are still with us to enjoy. And we salute them.
