News from the Parish Council and Recreation Field Trust



Last month in my first report in the magazine as the new Parish Council Chair, I had the benefit of a completed council meeting but for this report the meeting will occur after the deadline for report submission. Therefore, I will let you know that which I know has happened and that which I think will be of interest but is yet to happen. The Historical Society and the Community Asset Register held by SSDC have both received submissions of concern at the possible change of use of the WI community hall because of the stated intent to auction the building. Both organisations have the power to delay or prevent in some way a change of use. It may be that the best way forward is a proper consultation on options with the community. Much work is needed to resolve the best way forward for our cemetery. New legislation concerning difficulties with ground water in cemeteries will have to be resolved before the planned cemetery extension can go forward. The Friends of Misterton Cemetery Chapel (FoMCC) have dissolved themselves and entrusted the future of the Cemetery Chapel to the Parish Council and myself as the new chair, possibly because I was instrumental in forming FoMCC in the first place.

Misterton lit its beacon with others for the Jubilee celebrations. The village also showed its fair share of patriotic visual displays if perhaps not as strong as it might have been in the past. It has been suggested that the community spirit is not what it was 20 years ago so perhaps that is something we should be concerning ourselves with. Because it may take some time to replace our clerk the meeting on 21st June will consider proposals to form working groups for Cemetery, Roads, History and Community, Finance and Amenities which are easier to manage in the absence of a clerk but allow the work of the council for the community to continue. This structural change can also lend itself to co-opting villagers for their expertise and industry.

Roads remain a concern and a request at very short notice by BBC Outside Broadcast TV was accepted and Misterton featured on the programme about HGVs on 25th May. It covered three Somerset areas; Bruton, North Perrott and Misterton on the same topic but those who saw the broadcast will realise that only Misterton came up trumps with a first class HGV driven jam, featuring my wife Diane. I thought it was I as Chairman to do the job but the BBC wanted a female to balance its broadcast and I am sure people will agree Diane, having been deputy chair of the council for many years and a current Speed Watch participant with a real interest in the road problem, did a far better job than I.

I listened to the church bells ringing this morning, and wondered what they meant to people - an irritating noise? A call to prayer? A reminder, hopefully of our God of love.

Mark 1 35 'Very early in the morning, while it was still dark, Jesus got up, left the house and went off to a solitary place.'

The Retreat Association website has many interesting led retreats as well as silent retreats. Why not take a look?

Retreats can be life changing experiences and at the very least help us to put things back in right perspective. If you are at a stage in your life when this is not practical, why not just seek out an hour in a solitary place and pause in silence to give thanks to God, to count your blessings, and to reflect on your life?



Friends of Crewkerne Station, FOCS

The FOCS grew from a group campaigning to keep the booking office open in the threat of closure. The MP at the time, David Laws, supported the campaign and fortunately the station stayed open although with reduced hours. Nowadays the rail company prefers to appoint station ambassadors rather than a ticket office clerk, whose role is principally to help passengers and rail users in any suitable way rather than just sell tickets. Recent



changes with the rail operating company have meant that the Department for Transport has taken responsibility for South Western Railway and the post at Crewkerne is being staffed by temporary ticket officers at the moment. That should change soon for a permanent station ambassador working from 6:00am until 12.30pm every day except Sunday.

FOCS has developed from a campaigning group to a community group who work alongside the South Western Railway company to provide a better environment for travellers and station users and to help with friendly advice without encroaching on the role of station staff. They report on any faults or difficulties found at the station, help with litter picking, look after the planters with flowers, help promote rail travel and liaise with other stations

and members of the rail company. The history group has a good collection of information and photographs which have contributed to the information board on the platform. The information board has been set up by the Blackmore Vale Community Rail Partnership of which the FOCS are an active member. Recently the FOCS won the annual cup for the best

decorated station at Christmas.

Probably what is best known is the wonderful seasonal display of flowers on both platforms and we have learnt over the years what grows best in the planters. We tried half barrels before the cattle trough planters but found that the wood did not last. We have also tried unsuitable plants like cosmos which although looking beautiful grew too tall and wanted watering too frequently. Of course, keeping the plants looking good means constant



regular watering in dry spells, and good care. The Misterton side of the track which is not open to passengers has given us some interesting times. Firstly, we wanted to clear some of

the detritus on the platform without taking away all of the moss and weeds which help to make it look natural. This meant negotiations not only with Network Rail who have responsibility but also the owner of the Old Coalyard which has been developed into а small housing enclave. Now we have a locked access on to the platform and a tap to keep the planters watered by a rota of volunteers.



We attend many local fairs and fetes with our information stall and help to promote rail travel as well as attract volunteers to help with the care of wild and cultivated planting at the station. Many of our volunteers live in Misterton (as does the station) and we would love to see more of you at our Thursday morning 'work ins' at the station. There are also many supporters who pay an annual sub of £10 or £5 and receive regular newsletters about the FOCS and the railway including information about special tickets. Meetings are normally on a Wednesday evening at the Globe Inn but over the last two years we have met over Zoom.







Misterton traffic

Many may have seen our traffic problem featuring on the BBC West programme on Thursday 26th May. The request came from the BBC at very short notice through the parish council and despite trying to get others in the timescale, the only ones available were Paul and I. The next day coming back from Ilminster we pulled into Knowle Lane to see that it was blocked further up by a contractor repairing potholes and a few minutes later out of our front window a van turning round at the bottom of Knowle Lane, having reversed from the blocked lane. We did not see any road signs signalling the blocked lane. A little later one of our neighbours who normally parks in front of our house (as we know parking in Misterton is at a premium) called to point out that the capping stone on our front stone wall had been knocked and moved. The marks, doubtless of some vehicle, are clearly shown in this photo and only three feet away the pillar holding our gates which would have been the cause of much more damage. Coming so soon after the programme this makes me believe there are two lessons; a) when a vehicle is parked in front of the property or in the case of the pavement the pedestrian is protected from such likely damage in our narrow roads and b) if

we are to succeed in improving the situation it is essential that all such incidents are noted and recorded centrally, perhaps in the first instance to the parish council and subsequently the police and the roads authority.

We aim for this to take place on Friday 29th July commencing 6.30pm but obviously it is a bit weather dependent. July is often the hottest month of the year and a good time to sit and enjoy your garden. Of course, there are still things to be done so keep your plants looking good by dead-heading and regular watering. Weeds thrive in warm weather so put your hoe to good use!

For apple trees the so-called June drop may well have extended in July. It is a natural process, designed to stop trees bearing too much fruit and later breaking branches with their weight. However sometimes the process needs a helping hand - so do pick off the smaller developing apples if your tree is well laden. You will be rewarded in the autumn with larger and better fruit. Tomatoes, whether grown in the greenhouse or outdoors, will need regular feeding. As will beans, courgettes and indeed almost everything else. We find that

Tomorite is a very balanced fertiliser, good for virtually all vegetables, flowers, and shrubs.

Haven't the roses been good this year? Ours have been full of flowers and hardly any black spot. How difficult it is to say which rose has been best!! We are going through a phase of liking orange-coloured roses and have just bought a replacement one named Super Trouper at Groves Bridport (using our 10% off Misterton Gardening Club discount of course!!) Mum's Border Tart

After making two tarts for a Misterton Jubilee party, Maureen had requests for the recipe so she said she would put it into the magazine and here it is! Quantities below are for a round tart tray of approx 7in diameter. However, Maureen is used to doubling the quantities and using a 9in flan dish. This is because it is tasty and morish!

You will need:

Shortcrust pastry to line the tin. No need to prebake but pop it into the fridge to cool while you mix the filling.

Leftover pieces can be used to make a lattice on the top if you wish.

<u>Ingredients for the filling, using two bowls, one for each:</u>

A cupful of caster sugar mixed with one egg.

A cupful of sultanas mixed with 2oz melted butter.

Now mix all together and add approx 1 level dessertspoon of cornflour. The mixture should be softer than a sponge cake mixture, but not sloppy.

Fill the pastry case.

Cover in a lattice if you wish.

Bake in a moderate oven for about 25-30 mins until golden brown and firm. If you are doubling the quantity and using a larger dish, it will need longer, about 45 mins.

Cool.

It will keep happily in an airtight container for a fortnight out of the fridge, but you will eat it

before then!
