Looking ahead to 2023 seems quite a long way off and it is easy to delay in replying, however we do need to plan if we are to run a training session. If you have an interest in attending a short two-hour course one evening in January either for the first time or as a refresher, please let us know (MERT contact details are below).

The lovely autumn weather probably means we are not thinking about the flooding issues that sometimes impact the village. We all know that conditions can change quickly when the weather turns, so with the help of Somerset Prepared run by South Somerset District Council we are updating the MERT emergency plan for the village although we hope we will not need to use it. The updated plan will be on Parish Council website in due course.

After the disruption of the Covid pandemic the Misterton village litter pick has not taken place for a couple of years. The parish council will be organising another one soon with MERT supporting the event and hope some of the village will join in.

News from the Parish Council and Recreation Field Trust



Due to the forthcoming auction of the WI hall, our very recent parish council meeting was held at @Sue's Café (by the railway station) for the first time. Although slightly noisier, the seats were definitely more comfortable - thank you Sue for allowing us to use your premises.

The auction has also led to the parish council letter box being relocated, for the time being, to the pillar of the gates at Knowle House. It is an ideal home for the many lifestyle questionnaires still unreturned from the October magazine. Please do keep returning them so far, the questionnaires have indicated the desire for a number of new clubs and warm hubs but as there is currently a shortage of venues, the future of the WI hall has to be known before further progress can be made.

I have now been in post as chair for six months and am getting to grips with what needs to be done. I have a very supportive council and excellent new clerk and we have just co-opted two further councillors meaning we will move forward with a full team. All banking procedures have been updated, enabling the recently formed finance working group to meet. They will recommend next year's draft budget to the full council at the November meeting. This in turn leads to setting of next year's precept which will be very carefully considered, paying particular attention to the present economic situation.

Other developments include the setting up of road and cemetery working groups to cover a range of current issues, the approval of a much-needed seat for the cemetery and the acquisition of new legally required signs for the recreation ground. These together with byelaws should be erected soon. One further initiative we are taking is to seek a visiting Post Office van for half a day each week.

And finally, there are plans for the chairs of the village hall committee and parish council to meet and co-operate on future support by two friendly committees to counter the problems facing the village.

Letter from Anne

Traditionally November is a time for remembrance. The church commemorates All Souls day at the beginning of November when we remember all those we have loved and lost over the years. On 11th November we then remember all those who gave up their lives or their mental or physical health in service of their country. It is perhaps a reflective month before the busyness of December and Christmas hits us.

As I was reflecting on these acts of remembrance I came across some words

'Accept your wounds and your disabilities And know yourself loved by God.
Listen to your feelings
Listen to your story
And know yourself loved by God.'

As we go through life, there are very few of us who remain unscathed by loss. It may be the loss of loved ones, it may be the loss of our physical or mental health. It may be the loss of a marriage, or just the realisation that all those glorious plans we might have had for our life in our early years will never now come to fruition.

The important word for me from the above is *accept* what has happened. Stop fighting or resenting it. We need to accept our wounds and disabilities. If we hold on to our pain, we inevitably pass it on to others.

'Pain not transmuted is transmitted' a very wise person once told me.

We all long for peace in our lives, and by accepting our wounds, and knowing that we are all loved by God, we can find that peace. I love the BCP (Book of Common Prayer) evensong service and in that is the following prayer or collect based on Philippians 4.7

O God from whom all holy desires, all good counsels, and all just works do proceed: Give unto thy servants that **peace which the world cannot give**; that both our hearts may be set to obey thy commandments, and that we being defended from the fear of our enemies may pass our time in rest and quietness, through the merits of Jesus Christ our Saviour. Amen

I pray then that we can this month think about and acknowledge to ourselves our wounds and disabilities, and then lay them at God's feet. Let him deal with them so that we can float free and live our lives to the full.



David Scotney

David lives in one of the New Inn Cottages off Silver Street and has been there since 1994. He was born in Wimbledon in 1954. The family lived in Putney before moving near to Guildford in Surrey. His brother, who lives in Nottingham, is a retired mechanical engineer.

Their father was the Headteacher of a primary school near Tower Bridge in London, and their mother was an operator of a comptometer - a somewhat primitive key-driven calculator, but which was considered to be state-of-the-art in the 1950s.

During the Second World War, Scotney senior was an RAF turret gunner. On a routine bombing raid over Rotterdam docks, and at the Germans' request, he had to drop a prosthetic leg for the double-amputee Douglas Bader, only one of the pair remaining intact after Bader was eventually shot down by the Luftwaffe.

Bader was considered to be a flying ace in the Second World War, piloting both Spitfires and Hurricanes. He was credited with twenty-two aerial victories, even though he had lost both legs in an aeroplane accident in 1931, which he admitted was his own fault. After being shot down, he was sent to a POW camp where, despite his incapacity, he made so many escape attempts that he was moved to the infamous Colditz Castle, believed by the Germans to be escape-proof. On another occasion, David's father's Blenheim bomber was shot down over the English Channel, but the air in his turret miraculously shot him to the surface from where he was rescued. He had an unenviable war, having lost no fewer than twenty-seven roommates through enemy action. David still has his faded RAF blouse, complete with ribbon bars.

After primary school, David attended Guildford Cathedral Choir School, spending four years there as a chorister. The choir performed at both the Albert and Festival Halls. One of the choir's album recordings came second in the sales charts to the Rolling Stones. He then trained as a teacher in a Bradford college before going on for a year at Leeds University. From there, having declined a Headship in a German Service Children's School and another school in Singapore, he was appointed as Headteacher of a school in Southern Germany in the American Sector for sixteen years. Back in England, he became Headteacher at Ashill School, not far from Ilminster. David is divorced, but has a partner, Lindsay, who lives in Taunton. Like him, she is a retired Headteacher. He has travelled with her to Eastern Europe - Albania, Romania, and Transylvania. According to him, the trains in Romania were noteworthy for being the dirtiest of all. He and his brother have also been to visit relatives in Australia, India, and Malaysia. David is particularly interested in the First World War and has visited most of the European battlefields.

By his own admission, he is interested in most sports with the exception of rugby. He was once given a set of golf clubs, but soon found that he had no ability with them. On the other hand, he used to be a good skier. So much so, that he was a skiing instructor while teaching with the Army in Germany.

He has a fine collection of late-eighteenth-century English porcelain. He also likes to cook and has been on advanced courses run by Rick Stein in Padstow. He enjoys eating out, too. But most of all, he is a cat person. The walls of one of his bedrooms from floor to ceiling are given over completely to cat-show awards - medals and testimonials. There are several



hundreds of them, won at home and abroad. All the cats shown were from two breeds: Chinchillas and Colourpoint Long-Haired Persians. Both breeds of cats were UK Champions and Grand Premiers in the late 1990s

David's choice of books centres on the novels of Mervyn Peake, such as Gormenghast, Titus Groan and Titus Alone. As for music, David admires the Rolling Stones, The Who, Simple Minds, Queen, and Brian Ferry. But if banished to the BBC's fictional desert island, he would want to have with him *Love Over Gold* from Dire Straits' 1982 studio album of the same name.

In retirement, he still involves himself in schooling. He chairs local appeals panels determining the validity of decisions concerning children who have been excluded from particular schools, or parents who have been disappointed that their children have been turned

down from attending the school of their parents' choice.

David has amassed some sixty bottles of gin that he and Lindsay take care to drink from in turns. All the gins come from West Country artisanal distilleries.

Their favourite is Papillon gin with botanicals that include violets that blossom on the Devonshire moors.

Misterton Gardeners Association

Our meetings for this year are now over. We will begin again in the early spring (venue permitting). So now perhaps is an appropriate time to take stock as to what 2022 has been like in Misterton gardens.

We had a reasonable spring: late March and early April was fairly warm and quite dry. The blossom on our plum and pear trees came quite early - a bit too early perhaps for some pollinating insects. However, in the end there was a pretty good fruit set before the inevitable late frost came (which put an end to the wonderful display on our magnolia). April showers were a bit sparse, but we had some modest rain in May which enabled us to get our vegetable and flower seeds in okay.

Then came the heat, which went on and on. Some crops loved it - our courgettes, early potatoes, and dwarf beans in particular - as did most of our roses. Other crops (like runner beans and indoor tomatoes) almost gave up the ghost. September on the other hand was quite good for our gardens - the Michaelmas daisies and the dahlias have been full of flowers. And, as I write, have still not been hit by frost. So, as I say, every year for Misterton gardeners is different!

One plant that has liked the sun and heat this year is the canna or, to give it its proper name,



the canna lily. No wonder since it originates from the tropics. Cannas can grow very tall, but plant breeders have developed cultivars which are smaller and are rather more tolerant of our variable climate. Their leaves are typically pure green, but some have maroon and variegated ones. We have grown one or two cannas for some years now but the person who does best with them locally is George Sweetman of The Avenue. George has brought on a lot of cannas this year (some from just a packet of seeds). Canna flowers are red, orange, or yellow and sometimes a combination of all three (see photo). George says they do best if

given a weekly feed of Tomorite and phostrogen and planted where they can receive at least six hours of sunlight during summer. Let's all have a go with them next year!
