#### News from the Parish Council and Recreation Field Trust



My first few words for the new year are very personal and I would not normally be telling but I believe there are messages here that could save lives of fellow villagers and friends. On 26th November I was struck down by a stroke that totally paralysed my left side and affected my speech. 999 Ambulance might be there in two hours (for a category 1 event I believe the time should have been in the region of 18 minutes). My wife took the initiative and with the help of other members of the family and neighbours I was carried into the car and taken into A&E Yeovil. After tests and within an hour I received an intravenous injection and 15 minutes later was well again. I am very fortunate, but had I waited for the ambulance the chances are it would have been too late. Since returning Diane and I have decided that we need to fit ourselves with Careline in case, for example, I had been by myself. The message is for many, especially those by themselves to make sure in a similar emergency people can be alerted and action taken.

Now on to MPC matters, at last the new notice board has been erected and the byelaws posted in the recreation field and the safety measures that our inspector had been calling for are also erected. With the bureaucracy we have to comply with it took six months and is a good indicator of the difficulty of getting speedy resolutions.

The new cemetery charges are now on the website and will be applied from next year onwards. We were ridiculously cheap compared to the other cemeteries in South Somerset and it is our absolute duty to maintain this facility from council funds. I would like to see our MPC website as an automatic place to go for those seeking information about activities in the village so at our last meeting on 13th December, we agreed that we would give it a full overhaul in the forthcoming months. One of our councillors will lead but we will all take our part in reviewing section by section.

Finally, the most important discussion we had at our meeting in December was to agree that we would make available a celebration day for the village and its friends and families to commemorate the Coronation of King Charles III. Once again one of our councillors will take the lead but all of us will be working together with other members of the village to create a memorable event. We have decided that it will be a Misterton recreation field street party and will occur on Sunday May 7th 2023. The village hall has already been booked and some initial feelers put out. More information will be released as we get closer to the event, so please put this day in your diaries and let us make it a grand occasion.

# Crewkerne Station - a brief history

Crewkerne station with a single-track line was opened in July 1860. Bands played on the platform to welcome the train of 20 carriages with LSWR Directors on board. The town had been decorated and thousands came to celebrate the event and a grand dinner with speeches was held at the Swan Inn in town. It rained all day and there was even an eclipse of

the sun.

The station, designed by William Tite, now linked the town by rail to Waterloo and Exeter. Bradford and Son established sidings and buildings for incoming goods such as coal, fertilisers, and animal feedstuffs. This too allowed local companies to send their goods out by rail such as textiles, dairy produce and cattle, seeds, flowers and even rabbits! The early 1900s still saw horses used for shunting goods wagons.

**1940s** The war years saw the station handle military traffic and the arrival of evacuees. This was followed by the nationalisation of the railways in 1948. Later that year, on October 20th, a locomotive from the West Country Class No. 34040 was named Crewkerne at the station. Many townsfolk and local schoolchildren attended. One of the 2 nameplates can today be seen in the Chamber in the Town Hall.

**1950s** Express trains such as The Atlantic Coast Express and Devon Belle could be seen passing through on a regular basis. However, in April 1953, the locomotive hauling one such train, Merchant Navy Class No. 35020 "Bibby Line", shed a brake block when passing through the station at high speed causing a section of the canopy on the up platform to collapse, evidence of which is still visible today.

This decade also saw freight traffic at its peak with the platforms piled up daily with goods. Six goods trains would serve the station each day despatching mainly sugar beet, cattle, and products such as Van Heusen shirts and Bonsoir nightwear





produced in town. Goods coming in would include coal, construction materials and cotton and silk for shirt production.

1960s Due to regional boundary changes on the railways together with the onset of private car ownership and the increase in road haulage, the station saw a gradual decline in both goods traffic and passenger figures. The goods yards closed in 1966 and the line, which had been double track for over a century, was singled a year later.

**1970s - 1990s** During these three decades, the station saw its gas lamps replaced with electric lighting and new British Rail signage introduced. An error in the spelling of Crewkerne had to be quickly amended.



A lightning strike in 1982 resulted in part of the station building's chimney stack being demolished. Thankfully no one was injured. Most significantly however, in July 1992, the main platform was both widened and lengthened in order to accommodate the newly introduced longer diesel multiple units.

Today there are just a handful of signs left as evidence of a once thriving and bustling station, such as the signal box of the 60s and the original goods shed from the 19th century. A housing estate now occupies the old coal yard and today's timetable caters for very much increased passenger traffic, with a frequent service for both Waterloo and Exeter. 

#### Misterton Gardeners Association

We begin our programme for 2023 by having lunch at the Admiral Hood in Mosterton on Sunday 26th February. This is always a popular event open to members, their families and anyone in the village who might be thinking about joining our gardening club. I know it is a while away, but we are limited by numbers, so do book your place by contacting me as soon as possible. It is always a great occasion and a lovely way of getting together after what is likely to be a long hard winter.

January is, of course, a good month for thinking about your garden for the coming year. So do consider what you are going to plant and make a list of things to get or do. If you have got a small vegetable patch (as I have) think about crop rotation. When I was growing up, the old Misterton gardeners used to plan this carefully. They used to say that different plants required different soil nutrients and that rotation helped reduce a build-up of crop-specific pest and disease problems. But there is more to do in the month other than armchair gardening. We do get some nice sunny days in January so when these occur get out and do some pruning of your roses and fruit trees. Check your winter protection measures like stakes, ties, and supports (these are often loosened by severe weather). And if you have an outside tap, make sure it is adequately protected against frost as there is nothing worse than burst pipes when the weather thaws.

Even in January there is a bit of colour in the garden if you plan things right. We have a couple of red barked dogwoods; they are wonderful on a sunny day glinting in the wintery sunshine. As is our witch hazel with its spicy, fragrant yellow spidery flowers. And of course, at the end of the month the first snowdrops appear - they give so much pleasure and make us think of the gardening year ahead.



# Volunteer to be an Independent Visitor or Advocate for children in Somerset



These are fascinating and inspiring opportunities, which can bring real benefits to vulnerable children and young people. (Travel and reasonable expenses are reimbursed.)

You can help children and young people understand their rights and ensure that their views, wishes and feelings are heard.

### What is an Independent Visitor?

Independent Visitors are volunteers who befriend and spend time with a child or young person who is in the care of the Local Authority. By law all local authorities have to provide an Independent Visitor service.

In Somerset our intention is to encourage the relationship between the Independent Visitor and young person to continue beyond care. This way the care leavers continue to benefit from support, while making the transition to young adulthood. Independent Visitors are highly valued by the young people as they may be the only person involved in their lives who is not paid to be there.



#### What is an Advocate?

An Advocate is an independent person who can offer one-to-one support to children and young people to have their voice heard when meetings are taking place concerning their wellbeing. It's the role of the Advocate to speak up for the young person, make them aware of their rights, listen to them and represent their views, wishes and feelings. Why not join our bank of advocates? Your volunteering can be arranged to suit your availability. Your life experience will be highly valued and you will be trained and supported in developing key skills.
