## **Misterton Emergency and Resilience Team**

Despite the snow this morning MERT are looking to the spring and various activities that we are planning. We have agreed with the parish council to reinstate the village clean-up which used to be regular events before the lockdown due to Covid. The date we have in mind is the morning of Sunday 5th March when we hope to have small teams of villagers dispersing around the village to pick up litter, so we have the village spick and span for further events like the coronation celebration on Sunday 7th May. More details will follow in the March magazine but please put this is in your diary now if you are willing to help.

As usual we need to mention water challenges. MERT are keeping busy reporting, managing, and monitoring drains. In addition, the Misterton Parish Council clerk has been very proactive with Somerset Highways trying to get some action on issues we raise. The drains have behaved quite well, generally, during our 'wet season'. We also continue to keep an eye on the stream and run-off from the fields which is particularly challenging in certain parts of the village.

Finally, we will organise an Automatic External Defibrillator (AED) course if the village wants one. We do need to know if you are interested in doing a two-hour course for the first time or as a refresher. If you did not get an email from me recently, about this, then we are not aware of your interest.

### News from the Parish Council and Recreation Field Trust



I am writing this in mid-January as the snow is falling on Middle Street and I near the end of my first year as a Councillor. I hope my reports each month are useful and help to provide a better understanding of the work and objectives of your Parish Council. For example, at our January meeting we considered twelve matters arising from our December meeting, such as placing a three-year contract for grass cutting and installing a new bench in the cemetery, all of which had been successfully actioned. (Full details of decisions and actions can be found in the minutes of the meetings which are available on various noticeboards and also on the Parish Council website <a href="https://mistertonparishcouncil.org.uk/">https://mistertonparishcouncil.org.uk/</a>)

Perhaps the most significant decision for residents was the approval of the 2023-24 Budget and Precept. After careful consideration and ensuring that the services for which we are responsible are retained, it has been possible to reduce the village precept by 4.9%. Unfortunately, our changes are minor in comparison with the county and police part of your Council Tax, but it is a small help in the current climate.

Our plans for the coronation celebrations on 7th May at the recreation ground continue and we will give more details as events are confirmed. Currently you should expect music, food and drink, either brought by yourselves or bought on site, classic cars, dog competition, children's activities and more. Entrance will be free for all Misterton families and their guests and we are hoping that residents from all parts of the village will join us for a memorable day. We are determined that everyone living in Misterton should feel the benefit of a country village residence and to this end we now have a representative of Old Mill Estate on our council with the objective of encouraging much more integration between residents of Old Mill and the village.

Finally, I must return to what seems to be a perennial problem of dog activities on the recreation ground. Misterton residents are actively encouraged to use this area, but it is essential that dogs are kept firmly under control. Recently we have received several complaints of dogs that were not under their owner's control. This is not acceptable - dogs must not be allowed to run amok and, if necessary, must be kept on a lead - and we shall be adjusting our CCTV cameras to gain evidence of offences. We suspect some of those responsible may be outsiders arriving by car so we will try to get the message to anyone from Crewkerne or elsewhere to whom it might apply.

## Seville orange marmalade

(recipe from The Proper Marmalade Company)

You will need enough jars and lids for 6kg/13lbs of marmalade. This recipe can be halved (shorten final cooking time by 5 minutes before testing) but it is only making 26 half-pound jars, so think of it as one for every fortnight of the year.

#### **Ingredients**

6lbs/2.7kg Seville oranges

3 large lemons

6 ½ pints/3.75 litres water

Granulated sugar (Have at least three packets to hand; the exact quantity will depend on the juice content of the fruit, as below)

Wash the fruit to remove all dust and dirt. Seville orange skins are not treated but lemons often are. If you can't get unwaxed lemons, scrub them in hot soapy water and rinse.

Cooking the fruit whole makes the skins easier to cut. Put the whole fruit in a saucepan, lemons on the bottom, cover with the water and bring to the boil. Once boiling, reduce to a simmer and cover.

After about 20-30 minutes turn the fruit over so the lemons are at the top and the top fruit submerged. Simmer for a further 20 minutes. They are done when a knife pierces the orange skin with little resistance.

Take off the heat, keep lid on and allow to go cold, preferably overnight.

Keep all the cooking water. Cut the fruit in half and squeeze. You can use an electric squeezer or scoop out the flesh with a spoon and fork. Add the pulp and juice to the cooking water but discard all pips.

Slice each half-orange skin in half again, then cut width-ways into strips as thick or thin as you like. Add the shredded skin to the reserved juice, cooking water and measure. For each pint of this mixture, you will need 1lb/454g sugar.

Return the prepared fruit mix to the saucepan and add the sugar. Bring to a rolling boil and boil for 30 minutes only.

Test for a set: with a metal spoon take a small sample of the liquid, dribble a little onto a saucer placing the spoon and the saucer in the fridge for a few mins. One or other of the

samples should wrinkle when nudged with your finger. Stir, then let the marmalade stand for 15 minutes before potting for even distribution of peel. A skin may start to form which can be stirred in before potting. If the wrinkle test didn't work and no skin starts to form, re boil for no more than 5 minutes.

Pour into sterilised jars and seal immediately.

Good luck and happy marmalade making!

#### **Zena Durrant**

Zena, whose maiden name was Thornicroft-Taylor, is the eldest of five children four girls and a boy. She was born in 1954 at Epsom Hospital. At the time, her father was in the merchant navy, sailing mainly to and from South Africa and gaining experience for his career as a marine engineer. Her mother was a dental nurse. Having started her education at a prep school in Guildford, the family moved to Hampshire, where Zena attended the village primary school and then Eggar's Grammar School in Alton. The family moved again, first to Ascot in Berkshire where Zena went to Windsor High School, then to Somerset where her parents bought the Half Moon Inn at Horsington, near Templecombe, and she attended Bruton School for Girls. She took her A levels at Yeovil College, where she became editor of the student newspaper and realised she wanted to be a journalist.

Her first job was with the *Chard and Ilminster News*, travelling to reporting assignments on her 150cc Lambretta scooter. She met her future husband, David, at a wedding in Chardstock where they were both guests. They got engaged in 1976, then Zena moved to London to take a job as senior writer for the Metropolitan Police's in-house magazine, *The Job*. In 1979, the couple married at Stockland, Devon, after Zena had returned to Somerset to work as senior reporter for the *Western Gazette* in Yeovil.

The honeymoon was spent in Paris and their first marital home was in Merriott, where their three children were born and where Zena served for eight years as a parish councillor and as a governor of Merriott First School. She also founded *The Merriott Messenger*, a free monthly magazine delivered to every house in the village, and which is still published. In 1996, the Durrants moved to their present home in Misterton's Silver Street. Their elder daughter Katharine is a former Misterton Parish Clerk and is now Crewkerne Town Clerk. Daughter Holly and family live in north Devon; son Alex and family live in Derbyshire. There are eight grandchildren.

After a number of senior editing roles at the *Western Gazette*, Zena worked for three years as a part time volunteer coordinator at St Margaret's Hospice in Yeovil, and a further four years for a Christian charity - Sharing of Ministries Abroad - with whom she travelled to Uganda.

She and David are members of St Leonard's Church and in 2012 Zena was invited to join St Leonard's parochial church council. Reluctantly, she recently stood down from this role but continues to attend services at the church.

Sports at school were a mixed bag. By her own admission, Zena was useless at hockey and tennis. On the other hand, she represented her Alton school at county level for hurdling and long jump. She was also captain of her house rounders team



at Bruton. She recalls enjoying cross country running, although she never excelled, but she still enjoys "running" around the village to keep fit.

Her interests include gardening, sewing, writing, DIY and decorating, although many of these activities have had to be abandoned or cut back due to her failing eyesight. On the positive side, at least this gives her more time to spend with her grandchildren.

Like several other women in the village, Zena was once something of a rock chick, admiring Queen, the Rolling Stones and Led Zeppelin. Moreover, she has camped at three Glastonbury Festivals, seeing bands

ranging from Coldplay to Killers, Elbow to Pet Shop Boys, and memorable solo acts who included Rufus Wainwright, KT Tunstall, Neil Diamond, Leonard Cohen and Joan Baez. Zena was particularly moved by the singing of the late Amy Winehouse. Lingering evidence of her rock chick days is her predilection for wearing skinny blue jeans. She enjoys classical music too, travelling to London and Bristol for concerts and operas featuring the works of Handel, Bach and Tchaikovsky. She has more than seventy CDs of music by Handel, her favourite composer.

As for TV, Zena would never willingly miss the BBC's News at Ten, Have I Got News For You and Would I Lie To You. She used to enjoy sitcoms like Dad's Army, The Good Life, Fawlty Towers and Yes, Minister. She is a fan of comedians Lee Mack, Rob Brydon and the late Victoria Wood. She supports England in Six Nations rugby on TV and listens to a lot of BBC Radio 3 and 4 programmes. What she cannot abide are reality TV shows such as I'm a Celebrity, Love Island, or competitive cookery shows like The Great British Bake Off. Authors of some of her favourite novels include Sebastian Faulks, Joanna Trollope, Ernest Hemingway and Nevil Shute. As to non-fiction, she favours well-written memoirs like David Niven's and Bill Bryson's. If marooned on the BBC's fictional desert island, her single record of choice would be Joni Mitchell's I Could Drink a Case of You, and would dedicate it to her husband.

Zena curates the book swap in the former phone box in Silver Street. Since David's retirement as building control manager for South Somerset District Council, the couple have enjoyed the extra time available for country walks, and Zena also helps David in his capacity as the Parish Paths Liaison Officer.



If you grow early potatoes, chit them inside as this will allow them to start growing shoots and hence crop a couple of weeks earlier. Incidentally at Castle Gardens you can buy potatoes individually (i.e. just one potato if you wish!!) and carry out a small trial in your garden to see which suits your soil the best. The potatoes there are of the best quality, and they have a huge range of roses this year, all at very reasonable prices (even before the 25% discount).

In the flower garden, this year Diana and I are experimenting with different daffodils and seeing how far we can extend their flowering season. I will let you know how we get on and show an appropriate photo for each of the next three months. The first is February Gold. It is

the earliest we have (I know there are some which come out even earlier) but on a nice February day it is good to see this particular daffodil glistening in the wintery sun and, like snowdrops, give you a feeling that spring is just around the corner.

## **Refugee aid from Taunton**

Raft continues to request donations to send to those living in refugee camps and, if necessary, for those resettled in the Taunton area. They also help homeless people in need. Some refugees now volunteer with the charity, sorting and packing donated goods.

Raft requests blankets, sleeping bags, tents, but no other bedding is wanted at present. Suitable, clean, washable clothing for men (not large sizes please), women, children, and babies, plus hygiene items for all are always needed. Refugee Support Group receives your donations, and if necessary will collect, and transports them to Raft.

In addition, trustees at Raft have set up an eBay page where they are now selling individual clothing and footwear not suitable for life in camps. They need to be in good condition and would include those designated 'vintage'. Many, I expect, would be unwanted purchases or presents, and are sometimes even from businesses closing down. Raft uses the money to buy baby and hygiene products. They are also now having to find £18,000 a year for smaller premises where previously they were fortunate to have, from the council for free, a large premises awaiting redevelopment.
