Misterton Emergency and Resilience Team

Autumn arrived earlier this month with our first big rainfall for a few weeks. Whilst we have not been impacted as much as north Somerset the village was not totally unscathed. The good news is that the drain improvements are continuing at the bottom of Knowle Lane and the drain clearing service have been spotted in the village in mid-September. Unfortunately, as I get ready to submit this update to the magazine, there are reports of other blocked drains which we will raise with the relevant authorities.

The British Heart Foundation did a survey of some houses Misterton to check whether the members of the community know where the defibrillators are. From their brief ad-hoc survey it seems about half of those asked knew where they are. Here is a reminder. There are four of them and they are located at Sue's Café, Misterton Garage, the old phone box in Silver Street and the village hall.

The long-awaited defibrillator training is taking place on Saturday 14th October and those who have expressed an interest are being contacted.

As autumn progresses, please let us know of any issues in the village. .

News from the Parish Council and Recreation Field Trust



I note, on the day of our MPC meeting (19th September), that Somerset Council vehicles are out cleaning the drains. After our recent severe storms that might seem like closing the stable door after the horse has bolted. However, as far as I am aware, unlike many to the west of us in Somerset and Devon we did not suffer floods. We owe much to MERT and some of our residents in Middle Street who frequently clear our drains. Similarly, there are some living in Middle Street who regularly keep the pavements around them clean and brushed. On behalf of us all, I thank everyone who actively helps keep our village smart. On the opposite side of the coin there are a few who serve to soil our village by not picking up after their dogs despite the fine of £1,000 and those who allow their hedges to protrude their boundary over the road and of greatest concern, over the footpath particularly where brambles are embedded. Can I ask you all to check your boundaries and take action as appropriate this winter. I would rather not have to use our legal powers to take action and present householders with the bills that they would be required to pay.

It is with great personal sadness that I must tell you all that our excellent parish clerk, Jane, has tendered her resignation so that she can pursue sporting and travel adventures with her husband. When at a similar age, twenty years ago, Diane and I made such a decision and took two months to travel around the world. I hope that Jane's plans are equally successful, but it leaves a problem for MPC. I am asking you all to search your thoughts to help us find a replacement. It is a part time job that needs a good, organised administrator, comfortable with finance and familiar with office IT. If you have ideas, please call me on 01460 76761.



We agreed at our last meeting to hold back on new initiatives until we have a successor clerk in post. In the meantime, we have replaced the broken notice board on the junction of Silver Street and Turnpike Green and installed a board at the entrance to the cemetery to show when the chapel is open (first Sunday of the month and special days).

We have received three quotes for major hedge trimming in the recreation ground and cemetery and selected one for an early start of clearance. Our Speed Indicator Device (SID) is erected and operating but it will be some time before we understand it well enough to get the maximum benefit. Our finance working group will meet in October to consider the first six months income and expenditure. We are spending more than previously budgeted but this is offset by increase in income from VAT recovery, SID grant and coronation event. The new unitary county council has created a local community network to process work in Somerset. Top of priorities for all towns and villages was traffic levels and roads. MPC has agreed that it will work together with all others to gain a solution for our road problems with this county initiative. It is unlikely we will achieve anything by ourselves.

Bob Taylor

Bob and his wife, Alyson, are among the very few villagers who were born and bred in London. Since last year, they have lived in Dry Close at the bottom of Newbery Lane. The house was built in the 1600s and is listed Grade II. Why Somerset? As Bob says, 'I've always been a country boy at heart.'

Bob was born in 1947 at Wandsworth. He has two younger brothers, David and Michael, who live in Norfolk and Sussex respectively. Bob and Alyson, who were married in 1976, have two children: Ben and Amy. The photo on the opposite page features Bob and his daughter on her wedding day in Ibiza last October. There are four grandchildren: Alfie, Sienna, Lily, and Penelope.

Bob went to Sheringham school, and then to Wandsworth Comprehensive, which he left just short of his 15th birthday.


His father, affectionally known as Punch, had been a professional boxer before the Second World War. Old habits evidently die hard. In a pub on Wandsworth High Street, he once knocked out Frankie Huff because he had tried to steal Punch's pint. Huff had fought for the British middle-weight title and weighed in at over fourteen stone, whereas Punch weighed a mere ten stone.

Bob's father, who had never been further than Southend, was shipped off to North Africa at the start of the Second World War's hostilities and served there before sailing to Italy where he fought at the battle of Monte Cassino. He never went abroad again, even in peacetime. Whenever he was asked why the family used to stay in Margate for their holidays, rather than going to France or Spain, he said, 'I saw enough of Europe during the war.' And Punch's brother, Jim, had been one of the last members of the British Expeditionary Force to be evacuated from Dunkirk. The nearest the family ever came to the European mainland was when they went to the Isle of Wight. Bob's mother spent the war in an armaments factory making bullets. After the war was over, they all lived in an asbestos prefab, one of eight, on what had been a wartime bomb site.

At school, Bob took part in fives, rugby, and fencing. While there, he was taken with his classmates on a skiing trip to Austria, the first time he had travelled abroad.

His first job was at Victoria, working for the Godfrey Davis company, stripping down cars for the panel-beaters at £5 a week. Having passed his driving test, Bob was given an apprenticeship with Jack Barclay's, the Rolls Royce dealership, in its Battersea body-shop. In 1967, with two friends, he drove in his Ford Cortina across France, over the Swiss alps, through Italy and into Yugoslavia, a round trip of nearly 3,000 miles.

By now, he had met Wendy, his first wife, and married her in 1969. They spent their



honeymoon in Marbella, which was the first time he had been in an aircraft, and the couple moved to a new house at Biggin Hill in Kent. Sadly, the marriage lasted only two years. He moved to the family caravan, bought some years earlier with the spoils from a substantial betting coup, and found a job doing panel-beating in Chichester, Sussex. At 43 years of age, he re-trained as a fourcolour planner in the print trade, though the advent of Apple Mac caused him to be made redundant. He then started his architectural paint-spraying company, which he managed till his retirement at 65.

He met his second wife, Alyson, in 1975. She had taken a typing job at the Royal Courts of Justice, working her way up to becoming the PA to the Deputy Official

Solicitor. They were married at the same Croydon Registry Office where he had married his first wife, Wendy. He and Alyson honeymooned in an apartment in the south of France. The newlyweds moved to a cottage on the edge of Tonbridge Wells, Bob having found a job with a transport company.

He has always been a devout supporter of Fulham football club, and turned out for the local village team, ending up as their captain. He ran Tonbridge Wells Veterans football league as well as his own team, Frant Veterans.

The last book Bob enjoyed reading was 'Still Life' by Sarah Winman, possibly redolent of his father's experiences in war-torn Italy. His favourite film is 'The Commitments' and, on TV, 'Breaking Bad.' As for music, he favours the 1985 record 'Why Worry?' by Dire Straits, and the Small Faces' 1966 hit 'All or Nothing.' Now, though, he spends a lot of his time on his new home and its extensive plot of land. He is also a member of MERT, the Misterton Emergency and Resilience Team. Where do he and Alyson spend their holidays? 'Any Greek island will do for us,' he says.

True Londoners would describe Bob as a real diamond geezer. Rightly so, as he and Alyson have made themselves very welcome in our village.



Changes in the Benefice

I wanted to let you know about a very helpful plan leading to some rearrangements in our benefice. In response to the Deanery Deployment Plan, a pastoral reorganisation of the Benefices of Wulfric and Merriott with Hinton St George, Dinnington and Lopen will take place at the beginning of Advent 2023. This will involve the parishes of Haselbury Plucknett and North Perrott moving from the Wulfric Benefice to that of Merriott with Hinton St George, Dinnington and Lopen. From that point, these two villages will be under the oversight of Revds Julia and Bob Hicks, with day-to-day ministry carried out by a local ministry team compromising Reader Ian Stobart, Revd Andrew Daynes and Revd Canon Ian Gibson as well as continuing to receive the support of other ministers. This change in practice will be followed by the necessary legal changes, and during this time both sets of incumbents are committed to working closely together to enable ministry to flourish in these villages. There will be an opportunity to mark this change more formally later but at this time of transition, please do hold the new local ministry team and the villages of Haselbury Plucknett and North Perrott in your prayers.

I am very grateful for those who have arranged this. My prayer is that this will lead to Godgiven growth in Haselbury Plucknett and North Perrott as well as in Crewkerne, Hewish, Wayford and of course Misterton. Please pray for that and please contact me with any questions.
