### **News from the Parish Council and Recreation Field Trust**



It is with greatest delight that I can report a change in circumstances for our clerk, Jane, which has led her to withdraw her resignation. I am now happy to recommend to the council that we push forward as fast as we can on issues that need resolution. I am mindful that 18 months ago the village possessed five notice boards for the display of relevant Parish Council rules and regulations but only two of them were equipped with information sheets and in one the paperwork quickly disappeared as it was eaten by slugs. Today all five have their correct data and I encourage you to read these as they spell out the legislation under which we must operate. Our monthly meeting agendas with subsequent minutes are displayed in the boards at Mallabones, Old Mill Estate and the corner of Silver Street and The Avenue. The bye laws for the recreation field are on the recreation field board and rules governing the operation of the cemetery and chapel are posted on the board at the cemetery entrance. Information is also carried on our website mistertonparishcouncil.org.uk.

I trust that everyone is aware that the Parish Council share of your annual rate is far and away the smallest of your payments. The greater amount goes to Somerset Council, covering tasks previously undertaken by district and county and also separately the police cost. All involved should be well aware that at present many people are struggling to make ends meet. The unitary council is limited to 5% increase whereas for we parish councils the potential increase is limitless but that will not help our rate payers. At present the ruling county councillors are on the verge of bankruptcy and have asked parishes to fund some of the county council responsibilities. This can only be harmful for you the rate payers. Those who would replace county council once they become bankrupt are not restricted in the increase they can impose on your rates, and we cannot fund the responsibilities of county council without a further increase in our rates. A classic catch-22 caused by management failure. We are convening a separate meeting to investigate carefully what is at stake.

Extra benches and the table are ordered and hopefully they will soon be installed at the recreation field.

As I write this report, we are celebrating a second village clear up for the year and thanks go to all especially councillors White and Clifton. A full report is in the MERT section of this magazine.

Our meeting next month is on Tuesday 12th December and we take the opportunity to wish the whole village a happy Christmas.



### **History of Christmas customs**



The tradition of giving presents at what became Christmas dates from ancient times. Pagans in Europe and the Middle East exchanged presents at winter festivals. These festivals included Saturnalia, a raucous and old Roman event in honour of the God of

Agriculture. Revellers greeted one another with a joyful 'lo Saturnalia!', the Roman equivalent of 'Merry Christmas!' But it was only in the mid-19th century that Christmas presents became common in England. The first Christmas card was sent at about the same time.

Turkeys were first introduced from America in 1526 by William Strickland, a Yorkshireman.

He managed to get hold of a few from American Indian traders on his travels, and sold the turkeys for two pence each in Bristol. He was so proud of his acquisitions that his family crest was altered to feature a large turkey. Naturally enough, English people thought for many years that turkeys came from Turkey. Whatever they thought, turkeys were only associated with Christmas fare in Victorian times when they gradually replaced goose and capon as the main



ingredient of the Christmas meal. Henry VIII was the first English king to have eaten turkey.

Wartime food rationing in the Second World War affected everyone, especially housewives whose husbands were in the armed forces. Rationing lasted till 1954, nine years after the war ended, and the UK was the last country involved in the war to bring an end to rationing. Meat was the last item to be de-rationed. Incidentally, clothes were rationed in 1941 and soap was rationed in 1942.

Housewives (hardly any men knew how to cook in those days) were encouraged to make the best of food shortages. One of the Christmas dishes they were expected to create was something called murkey, otherwise known as mock turkey. The published list of ingredients consisted of a single onion, a single leek, three slices of bacon, a small parsnip, dried sage, a knob of lard and as much sausage meat as was available from the butcher. The instructions for making murkey were:

Fry the chopped onion and leek in the lard.

Mix the sausage meat with an equivalent volume of breadcrumbs.

Add the onion and leek.

Form everything into the shape of a turkey crown.

Parboil the parsnip for 10 minutes.

Cut it lengthways into two and place them in the position of real turkey drumsticks. Cover the whole of the 'breast' with the bacon.

As for Brussel sprouts, they only became popular in the 1800s.

Mock goose included dried lentils, slices of bread, an onion, chopped sage, butter, chicken stock and lemon. Mock marzipan's ingredients were 4oz of flour, 4oz of sugar, 2oz margarine and 2 teaspoons of almond essence.



Christmas pudding originated in medieval England, though it only became associated with Christmas in the mid-16th century when the Puritans soon banned it as being wasteful and likely to encourage people to eat and drink to excess. In earlier years, Christmas pudding was called frumenty, a completely different pudding from what we eat now as it consisted of beef and mutton, raisins, prunes, spices, and wine. By the end of the century, it had gradually changed into plum pudding with eggs and breadcrumbs. Later recipes showed that there were thirteen ingredients to represent Jesus Christ and the

twelve disciples.

A Christmas pudding recipe published in 1944 included baking powder, grated nutmeg, cinnamon, mixed spices, suet, sugar, dried fruit, breadcrumbs, marmalade, reconstituted dried eggs and a quarter pint of milk.

Christmas cake was originally eaten on Twelfth Night. It started off as plum porridge enriched with butter, flour, eggs, dried fruits. Spices were also added to symbolize the gifts of the three wise men. The cake was decorated with marzipan and icing.

The singing of Christmas carols dates from the 4th and 5th centuries. 'Good King Wenceslas' was composed in the Victorian era as Queen Victoria herself wanted a happier, more upbeat song to sing at Christmas.

Pantomimes are a revival of ancient Roman comedies with slapstick humour and ridiculous

jokes. And Christmas crackers were invented in the 1840s.



The hanging of mistletoe goes back to the time of the ancient Druids. It was supposed to



bring good luck to the household and ward off evil spirits.

Boxing Day was traditionally a day off for the servants. As a present, they often received a special Christmas box - hence Boxing Day.

We wish all our fellow villagers a very happy Christmas and New Year.


